

## January 28, 2019 UHNA General Meeting Minutes

- 1. Meeting called to order by President Heather Sheets at 7:05pm
- 2. Executive Committee reelected with the exception of the vacant Treasurer position.
- 3. Kathryn Kolb, Director of EcoAddendum gave a presentation on the City in the Forest initiative:
  - a. The Atlanta tree ordinance is not good at saving trees.
  - b. A new draft will be written over the next 3-6 months.
  - c. Atlanta's growth was not normal for large cities. It began in the 1960's.
  - d. A lot of the tree canopy was retained on hard to develop land.
  - e. The old forest in Atlanta is on steep slopes, stream corridors, rocky places, historic places and older properties.
  - f. Old soil is good for trees unlike graded clay that contains high levels of aluminum.
  - g. Low value landscapes are considered canopy. Would like the city to prioritize high value canopy.
  - h. Canopy is being lost in back and side yards of teardowns. Also, large footprint rebuilds are causing runoff problems.
  - i. 95% of canopy is on private property including 80% on single family residence property.
  - j. Options are to replant, doesn't really replace, or purchase greenspace which is too expensive and not effective.
  - k. The Build with Trees 4 Step Plan is:
    - i. Plan for trees pre-construction
    - ii. Preserve the best trees
    - iii. Set a maximum sustainable footprint
    - iv. Effective enforcement
  - I. Other improvements:
    - i. Minimum green space required for all zoning
    - ii. Cluster design eliminate standard setback and frontage requirements
    - iii. Conservation easements
    - iv. Tax relief to homeowners who retain trees
  - m. Margaret Brady from City in the Forest presented a resolution to follow the Build with Trees 4 Step Plan when rewriting the tree ordinance
    - i. Decided to defer voting on resolution until a later meeting.
    - ii. Sample letter to council members was presented
- 4. Deniece Johnson from Blandtown discussed the potential concrete plant on Huber St. in Blandtown:
  - a. SRM Concrete wants to build a concrete plant at 1521 Huber St.
  - b. Property is zone I-2 but would need a Special Use Permit for a concrete plant.
  - c. SRM wants to connect Huber St. to Fairmont Ave. to allow trucks access to Huff Rd.
  - d. Property is 150 ft. for the last house.
  - e. Property purchase is contingent on Special Use Permit and street connection
  - f. Jim Martin of NPU-D has been guiding the neighborhood through the process
  - g. SRM is trying to gain entry into the Atlanta market
  - h. Neighborhood voted unanimously to support Blandtown's effort to oppose the concrete plant.



- 5. Elizabeth Hollister gave an update on the Upper Westside CID:
  - a. Funding for Complete Streets Howell Mill (\$12M) and Howell Mill Signal Project (\$3M) is not at risk in the rebaselining for Renew Atlanta
  - b. Continue to advocate including responding to the Renew Atlanta survey.
  - c. Clark Dumas reiterated the continued advocacy because some projects have been cut.
  - d. Signals project will include timing and monitoring. Also, new signals at Beck@Howell Mill and Emery@Collier.
  - e. Complete Streets may not have money for sidewalks.
  - f. There will be a fire station signal and signal priority for emergency vehicles.
  - g. The CID will landscape the ramps on Howell Mill, with GDOT approved plants.
  - h. Project scheduled for March or April
  - i. CID will try to get pedestrian beacons
  - j. Also trying to get benches and bike racks for the 17<sup>th</sup> and Northside park.
- 6. Clark Dumas and Jeremy Blair gave the Traffic Committee update:
  - a. Nextdoor survey prompted traffic studies.
  - b. Just received data two weeks ago.
  - c. As a result of the survey and studies the stop sign at Harper and Woodland Hills was added because of volume and visibility.
  - d. Also, the Don't Block the Box boxes were painted on Howell Mill at Ridgeway, Defoor and Chattahoochee
  - e. Too much traffic on Defoor for stop signs.
  - f. No data on Volberg and Ridgeway.
  - g. Not enough speeders on Marvin and Springer for speed humps.
  - h. In process of repairing sidewalks and replacing water meter covers.
  - i. Will fight for right-in/right-out of QT.
  - j. Researching using "paper streets" as pedestrian alternative on Howell Mill. "Paper streets" are streets that are listed on maps but are not built out.
